Existing commitments related to marine litter

- Meet good environmental status by 2020 (Marine Directive)
- Circular Economy Package
- ✓ Target for beach litter and lost fishing gear (30% by 2020)
- ✓ Plastics Strategy by 2017
- Definition of a new reduction target by 2020 (7th EAP)
- Significant reduction committed in SDG 14 and Rio+20





Marine litter



Aspirational target of 30% for marine litter **Strategy on plastics** (2017)

- Focus on marine litter
- Recyclability/biodegradability / Bio based plastics
- Vision/actions on Microplastics
- Strategy for most found items (?)

Roadmap to be published ... soon

Waste proposals

- Higher recycling target for plastics (55% by 2025), to be defined for 2030
- Litter included in the waste management plans
- Common rules on Extended Producer Responsibility
 - links between fees paid and recyclability/reparability Contribution of the producer to public campaigns



Next steps and challenges

- Analysis of Member States' Programmes of Measures under the MSFD
- Determining baselines for assessment of environmental status and for monitoring progress towards reduction
- Addressing microplastics from products in the context of the Plastics Strategy, planned for 2017
- Support implementation of the 30% by identification and reduction of most frequently found items on beaches
- Detailed investigation of aquaculture and waste from fishing activities
- Review of the WFD and REFIT of UWWTD
- Global sulutions through global governance for marine litter (UNEA-3, G7, oceans governance and beyond)
